ORDER GRANTING FIRST AND THIRD CLASS LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWAL SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS

The Liquor Control Board ("Board") held proceedings on April 11, 2018 in Montpelier to consider

Squeaky Wheel, Inc. d/b/a Filling Station Restaurant's ("Applicant") First and Third-Class Liquor License

Application (the "Application"). Jacob A. Humbert, Esq., Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the

Vermont Department of Liquor Control (DLC). Jennifer Kaar, owner, appeared on behalf of the Applicant.

Upon consideration of the testimony and evidence presented, the Board decided unanimously to grant the

Application subject to the conditions that (1) Ms. Kaar shall not consume and/or be under the influence of alcohol

on the licensed premises at any time, whether as an employee or as a patron; (2) Ms. Kaar shall not be charged

with any alcohol-related offense; and (3) if Ms. Kaar is charged with any alcohol-related offense, Licensee shall

notify DLC by 4:00 p.m. on the next business day following any such charge for any alcohol-related offense

against her in any jurisdiction.

The Board GRANTS the application for First and Third-Class Liquor License renewal for the 2018-2019

period subject to conditions (1) and (2) remaining in effect until and unless lifted by the Board.
